Warrenpoint Harbour Capital Works for New Customs Quay Breakwater, Container Berths 4 & 5 Deepening and Restoration of Turning Circle

Project

As part of their continuing harbour development, Warrenpoint Harbour Authority contracted to build a new breakwater from the Customs Quay to protect the fishing boats in the Town Dock, and to deepen existing Berths 4 & 5 to accommodate deeper draught container ships.

In order to implement these works, associated capital dredging was required as well as capital dredging to relocate and restore the turning circle to accommodate the larger vessels.

ADBP undertook the licensing process, and contractor selection and tendering through the EU Public Procurement route. We managed the capital dredging and associated environmental and archaeological monitoring contracts. Historic artefacts were recovered during the course of the dredging contract.

A suspect explosive device was loaded during dredging, which closed the Harbour and required liaison with the authorities for its safe disposal.
